

## Using your new bullets with the Atahualpa theme

**Note:** All these bullets are my own design. Please feel free to alter them in any way you like. They were all designed using Paint.net.

### Downloading the bullets

You will have been sent to the download link when you purchased the bullet pack.

The download is a zip file. You will need to extract (unzip) the file bullets.zip and save it to your computer. I suggest you save it to a folder in Documents/My Documents so you know where you saved it.

### Installing the bullets


1. Use ftp software to transfer the bullet (or bullets) to this folder:

**Wp-content/themes/Atahualpa/images/icons**

2. Add the snippet of code on the next page into the CSS inserts box of the Atahualpa theme options.

You can just copy and paste the code exactly as it is.

## Using the Bullets

- If you look at this code you will see these two lines:

background: url(/wp-content/themes/atahualpa/images/icons/ticklavender.gif)

background: url(/wp-content/themes/atahualpa/images/icons/tickgreen.gif)

- The first line (where I have used the lavender tick) is the bullet that will appear normally.
  - The second line (where I have used the green tick) is the bullet that will appear when a user hovers their mouse over the list item.
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- To change the bullets, simply type the name of the bullet/s you want to use instead of ticklevarendar, or tickgreen. Make sure you leave the .gif extension and make sure you leave the final ) at the end of the line.

## Examples

All of the bullets have transparent backgrounds, so will blend into the background of your widget.
